

Clematis List 2011

1	Blooms early in the spring. Flowers formed on last year's wood. Prune only when flowering is done. Prune to maintain shape.				
2	Blooms late in spring, early summer. In the spring before clematis blooms, prune stems back to a set of live buds.				
3	Blooms in summer / fall. In the spring, cut every stem back to a foot from the ground.
