

## FRUIT TREE LIST 2011

Apple Braeburn	Excellent flavor, mildly sweet and aromatic with firm, crisp and juicy texture. Late maturing. (Self-fertile)
Apple Fuji	Truly the home gardeners favorite. The flesh is very firm, crunchy, juicy and slightly acid. Outstanding shelf life. Trees are hardy and very productive. Bears heavy crops and keeps very well. (Needs Pollinizer)
Apple Gala	A dessert quality apple with firm, fine-textured, yellow-white flesh. Fruit keeps very well. Ripens September to October. Needs pollinizer.
Apple Golden Delicious Semi-dwarf	Been around since 1890,the fruit is sweet,juicy and crisp, golden yellow. Trouble free of late frost and disease resistant. Ripens Oct. Excellent storing. Self fertile
Apple Honeycrisp	15' H . The fruit is crisp and juicy. Excellent storage. Needs pollinizer.
Apple Newtown Pippin	Extensively cultivated in New York since 1768. Thomas Jefferson planted Newtown Pippin at Monticello. A large round green fruit.Good tasting, Excellent storing, Needs pollinizer
Apple Pink Lady	Large apple with a pink blush over a yellow undertone Does well in our area due to our warm autumn .Keeps 3 months Self-fertile
Apple Red Delicious	The tree is large and upright. The most popular of all fruit. Needs pollinizer.
Apple Red Jonagold	Red fruit is unusually large,with juicy yellow white flesh. One of the finest eating and cooking apples will keep for several months. Needs Pollinizer
Apple Spitzenburg	One of the great American apple varieties,thought to be Thomas Jefferson's favorite.Discovered in the early 1700's.Excellent for eating fresh,baking,applesauce.A good keeper Needs pollinizer
Apple State Fair	Bred at the University of Minnesota,State Fair is a very hardy,cooking and eating apple with juicy,tart yellow flesh and red skin.Zone 4 Needs pollinizer
Apple Tydemans Late Orange	Tydemans late orange has a lovely crackled coloration of purplish orange red over pale yellow green flesh. Crisp texture Cox style apple. Will keep till April.Introduce 1930.(Self-fertile)
Apple Yellow Transparent	From Russia 1880,skin is clear yellow and flesh is white. A very heavy producer, pick before maturity for better storage life. Self-fertile
Apricot Chinese aka Mormon	An early bearing, heavy producing variety. The fruit is of good quality and medium size, with yellow to medium orange color. Good flavor and smooth texture. Trees do well in colder climates. Good pollinizer. Ripens mid-June thru mid-July. Does well in late frost areas. Skin color is orange with red blush. (Self-fertile)
Apricot Moongold	Nectarine Dwarf 12-15' H A very hardy and cold hardy apricot. Plum size golden fruit, very sweet. (Self-fertile) Hardy to -10.
Apricot Sungold	Dwarf 12-15' H Bright clear gold fruit up to 1 1/4" with a mild sweet flavor. The fruit ripens in August. Hardy to -10 (Self-fertile)
Cherry Bing	One of the finest sweet cherries in the western states. The skin is dark burgundy-red when ripe. Ripens mid to late June. Needs pollinizer.
Cherry Stella	Semi-dwarf (10-12' ) cherry tree produces large,dark red fruit that is firm and sweet.Bears at young age. Self-fertile
Cherry Sweetheart	Semi-dwarf Last to ripen in the season around mid-July.Cherries from these trees are firm and excellent flavor. Self -fertile
Cherry Utah Giant	More flavorful,larger and more firm than a Bing or Lambert. Flesh is dark red and very sweet,a great cherry for our climate.Needs pollinizer
Nectarine Fantasia	A large, yellow fleshed nectarine. The fruit is highly colored, firm, freestone and good quality. Ripens in mid July. Vigorous grower. (Self-fertile)
Nectarine Red Gold	The most widely planted nectarine tree.Very large red and gold fruit with a juicy yellow flesh. Harvest time mid August. Self-fertile
Peach Elberta Edwards Greenhouse	Fruits are large, freestone, colored a deep golden yellow, blushed red with firm yellow flesh. An excellent pollinizer. (Self-fertile)

Peach Frost	Resistant to the peach leaf curl.Flesh of this freestone variety is delicious,sweet and firm.Good for canning ,freezing and eating fresh. Ripens in midspring.Self-fertile
Peach Giant Elberta	A large, high quality free stone peach. It is a superior early selection of Elberta. (Self-fertile)
Peach Harken	This is the best flavored peach for our climate.From Canada hardy and widely adapted it is very sweet and bears a regular crop of large freestone peaches.Ripens early august. Self-fertile
Peach Red Haven	The color is a beautiful red and golden yellow. The flesh is firm, smooth textured and fine flavored. Good for freezing and canning. (Self-fertile)
Peach Reliance	Trees are know for being very hardy can be grown In zone 4! Golden fruit are medium size with a red blush freestone . Excellent for canning, good for pies. Ripens in early august. Self-fertile
Peach WSU Q 1-8	Q 1-8 is a white fleshed peach,semi-free stone,ripening in early august.Curl resistant when established. Very productive. Self-fertile
Pear Asian 20th.Century	20th.century pears are medium-sized asian pears with mild fragrance. Skin is yellow flesh is white,very juicy,very sweet.Originated in Japan by chance in 1888. Self-fertile
Pear Asian Cho Juro	Rare heirloom japanese variety.Orange skinned,cream colored flesh,with a butterscotch flavor Self- fertile
Pear Asian Shinseiki	Golden pear with white,sweet,crisp and juicy flesh. Ripens in late july to mid august and stores well until march. Self-fertile
Pear Aurora	"Maybe the world's best pear" Large, bright yellow lightly overlaid with a beautiful russet, frequently blushed. Keeps well in storage. Needs pollinizer.
Pear Bartlett	The leading pear variety both commercially and for home use. It is an outstanding canning variety. Trees bear young and have compact upright growth. Ripens mid-July. Needs pollinizer.
Pear Comice semi-dwarf	The "connoisseur's pear,from France 1849. Produces a large pear with a very juicy,melting flesh,outstanding flavor. Needs pollinizer.
Pear Moonglow	Disease resistant. Attractive fruit with soft red blush. Best picked when green-yellow. Needs pollinizer.
Pear Parker	1934 University of Minnesota introduction. Large, yellow-bronze fruit. Fine grained; tender & juicy. Upright and vigorous grower. Ripens in August. 15' H Needs pollinizer.
Pear Seckle	It is generally believed that a Pennsylvania farmer named Seckel discovered the fruit near Philadelphia in the 18th century. Fruit is small but extra sweet commonly called sugar pear . Excellent flavor. The tree is slow growing ,semi-dwarf. Self-Fertile.
Persimmon Coffee Cake	Unique spicy sweet flavor that evokes images of cinnamon pastry. Non - astringent and can be eaten while still firm. Hardy A very attractive garden worthy tree.
Plum Italian Prune	One of the leaders in plantings of all prunes. The fruit is medium to large with dark purple skin. Excellent fresh, canned or dried. Ripens August. (Self-fertile)
Plum Santa Rosa	The most popular plum tree to plant,Santa Rosa have a delicious flavor,fruit is large,attractive dark purple color with red flesh.Fruit is firm Needs pollinizer
Plum Satsuma	Satsuma plum is a large japanese variety,dark solid red skin and dark red flesh. Fruit is firm and juicy. Needs pollinizer
Plum Superior	Japanese variety selected for the large fruit,vigor and hardiness.Excellent for cold regions. Fruit ripens in august .Needs pollinizer
Plum Toka	Produces a fruit that is red and of medium size; richly flavored with apricot colored flesh. Introduction 1911. One of the best pollinators.Very Hardy, Self-fertile
