All Blue	130 days	High yields of medium sized oblong tubers with blue/purple skin and flesh. Plants have beautiful blue flowers. Great for colorful potato dishes.	\$0.95/lb.

All Red	90-110 days	Medium to large tubers with smooth red skin, shallow eyes. Moist, creamy flesh is swirled with pink, retains color after cooking. Makes delicious and unusual potato salad, scalloped potatoes, mashed potatoes. A.k.a. Cranberry Red.	\$0.95/lb.
Organic All Red			\$1.95/lb.
Cal White Organic	95-100 days	Heavy producer of large, long, oval potatoes with pale buff skin, medium deep eyes, white flesh. Record yields. The best white baking potato and excellent for French fries. Stores well.	\$1.95/lb.
Caribe Organic	95-100 days	produces large, uniform tubers, with lavender skin and white flesh. Very tasty and pretty boiled, steamed, or mashed. Not a good keeper. Resistant to heat and drought, scab and storage rot; can be grown almost anywhere; great for home gardens.	\$1.95/lb.
Dark Red Norland	75 days	Early, high yields of red tubers with burgundy skin, white flesh, shallow eyes. Great fried and in potato salad. In storage, skin fades to pink.	\$0.95/lb.
Fingerling, Red Thumb Organic	85-90 days	New, rare fingerling with brilliant red skin and reddish-pink flesh. Medium to long (3 to 4 in. by 1 in.), uniform tubers with shallow eyes. Very productive. Colorful and delicious addition to any potato recipe.	\$4.95/lb.
Kennebec Organic	90-100 days	Very large, oval, uniformly shaped potatoes with thin tan skin, dry white flesh, shallow eyes. Excellent all purpose potato that stays flavorful through fall and winter storage and is good for all recipes. Vigorous plants are drought tolerant, and resist late blight, black leg, viruses A and Y, but not scab. High and dependable yields. Requires close planting - 8 to 10 in. apart.	\$1.95/lb.
Red LaSoda	110 days	Adaptable, heat tolerant. Best storing red. High yields of large tubers with red skin, white flesh, deep eyes.	\$0.95/lb.
Red Pontiac	110 days	Adaptable, heat tolerant. High yields of large, round tubers with dark red skin, deep eyes, white flesh. Stores well. Let potatoes cure in ground for a week or two after vines die back, to firm up thin skin.	\$0.95/lb.

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Russet Burbank	100 days	The "Idaho Potato," from Luther Burbank's work. Medium to high yields of tubers with russet skin, shallow eyes, white flesh. Stores well. Needs consistent watering.	\$0.95/lb.
Russet Norkotah	90 days	Medium-sized plant, good choice for small gardens. Large tubers have red/brown skin, white flesh, store well. Early, but lower, yields.	\$0.95/lb.
Viking Purple Organic	90-100 days	Smooth, red splashed purple skin, great tasting, slightly sweet, snow white flesh. Choice variety for any recipe. Round tubers average 3½ - 4" in diameter, in a good year may be even larger. Excellent for storage.	\$1.95/lb.
Yukon Gem	100 days	Round to oval potatoes with smooth, light yellow skin; pink splash around eyes, light yellow flesh. Possibly higher yields than Yukon Gold (its paternal parent); blight resistant.	\$0.95/lb.
Yukon Gold	80 days	Early, high yields of large, round tubers with yellow flesh, shallow eyes. Moderate keeper. Heat tolerant. A great potato, excellent baked or mashed.	\$0.95/lb.
COMPANIONS FOR POTATOES		Bush beans, basil, corn, cabbage family, peas, summer savory, marigolds (single petal varieties, non-hybrid if possible), horseradish, onions, allysum. Potatoes do not like sunflowers, cucumbers, tomatoes, pumpkins, squashes.
