## **Clematis Pruning**

Every variety, regardless of group, should be cut back to about 5" from the ground the first year after it is planted.					
Group 1	Blooms on old wood i.e. previous season's growth. Light pruning to remove any dead bits is all you need to do. For the Montana's you can control the size by hard pruning after flowering.				
Group 2	This group drives people crazy, it flowers on both old and new wood. So you want to prune lightly to remove dead bits in early spring and after the first flowering cut back about 1/3 of the vine. Don't worry if you prune a type 2 like a type 3, you will have just delayed the flowers until later in the season.				
Group 3	Be ruthless, cut back to 8"-12", this should include 2 strong sets of buds.				
Non-clinging	The clematis will not naturally climb on its own and will benefit from being staked or supported by other plants in the garden.
