<u>Watermelon:</u> Grow watermelon in full sun and well-drained, fertile soil. Provide consistent water to young plants through fruit set. Reduce water as fruits ripen to increase sugar content. Harvest watermelon when the tendril closest to the fruit is dry or when the portion of the rind resting on the ground is yellow.
